 - Represent Monmouth County at the Annual NJ 4-H Shooting Sports Banquet.

Time Commitment: Assist with any county project area special events and the county fair. Possibly represent Monmouth County at various state and national events. Serve as a mentor for other 4-H'ers.

Term/Appointment: one year term + (can continue as part of the Shooting Sports Ambassador Team)

Responsibilities:

- Attend Ambassador Team Training in September.
- Present awards at the Annual 4-H Achievement Night.
- Attend Advisory Council meetings.
- Attend one county 4-H Association meeting and one Board of Agriculture meeting.
