Dear Future Gardeners:

The Junior Master Gardener Committee is accepting applications for the 2025 JMG Program to be held at the Monmouth County Agriculture Building, 4000 Kozloski Road, Freehold. The program is open to Monmouth County residents ages 9 to 11 years in Grades 3 through 5. JMG is a unique eight-week gardening program which includes hands-on experiences in both the classroom and in the garden under the supervision of certified Rutgers Master Gardeners. Children completing all eight weeks of this program will receive certification as Junior Master Gardeners.

The JMG Program will be held on Saturday mornings with classroom drop-off at 9:00 a.m. at the rear entrance of the Agriculture Building. Pick up time is 12:30 p.m. in the garden. Classes are scheduled for April 26, May 3, May 10, May 17, May 31, June 7, June 14 and June 21. It is expected that the JMG students attend all classes. After the classes are complete, the children are encouraged to return to the garden once a week on specified days to harvest for their families or for donation to local food banks.

Junior Master Gardeners may enter their harvest in the Monmouth County Fair Home Gardeners' Competition. This year, the Fair runs from Wednesday, July 23 through Sunday, July 27. We will meet at the JMG garden on Thursday afternoon, July 24 to select and prepare entries. Parents are responsible for delivering their child's entries to the fairgrounds on Friday morning, July 25.

Please complete and return the enclosed application and media release with the \$50 registration fee as soon as possible. The JMG program is very popular, and completed applications are accepted on a first come-first served basis. Deadline for applications is January 31, 2025. Under the instruction of Rutgers Master Gardeners, JMG engages children in novel, hands-on group and individual experiences which provide a love of gardening, develop an appreciation for the environment, and cultivate the mind.

Students are encouraged to donate their surplus harvest to local food pantries and to enter what they have grown in the Monmouth County Fair Home & Garden competition. Eight classes are held on Saturday mornings from April through June. Applications are sent out every January.
